



1           6.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire on from March  
2 19, 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided  
3 in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court  
4 days to not more than 15 court days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(9));

5           7.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,  
6 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
7 section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days (Gov.  
8 Code, § 68115(a)(10));

9           8.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,  
10 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
11 section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody  
12 pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than 7 days (Gov.  
13 Code, § 68115(a)(11));

14           9.       In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,  
15 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
16 section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody  
17 pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to not more than 7 days  
18 (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

19           10.      In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,  
20 2020 to April 3, 2020 inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time periods provided in  
21 sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into  
22 custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony must be given a detention  
23 hearing or rehearing to not more than 7 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

24           11.      In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,  
25 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
26 section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile  
27 dependency petition must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12)); and

28           12.      In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from March 19,

1 2020 to April 3, 2020, inclusive, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided in  
2 section 657 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition  
3 for a minor charged with a felony offense must be held by not more than 15 days (Gov. Code,  
4 § 68115(a)(12)).
