Pursuant to California Rule of Court, rule 5.430 (g), any person who wishes to make a complaint or objection regarding the performance of the Family Law Facilitator shall make such a complaint in writing and shall file it with the Court Executive Officer within sixty (60) days of the last event leading to the complaint. This procedure applies only to those persons who have actually utilized the services of the Family Law Facilitator. The Court Executive Officer shall, in their discretion, investigate the merits of the complaint and shall take such action as they deem appropriate. The Court Executive Officer shall inform the complaining party upon receipt of the complaint and shall thereafter inform the complaining party that either action has or has not been taken. The Court Executive Officer shall take such other action as the Court Executive Officer deems appropriate.

This standing order shall expire on December 31, 2023.
