STANDING ORDER  
2026-13

Unless approved by a written order of a Judge of the Superior Court, no filming, videotaping, photographing, and/or electronic recording is permitted in any area of the courthouse, including, but not limited to, entrances, exits, and hallways. Application for filming, videotaping, photographing, and recording in said areas shall be directed to a Judge of the Superior Court.

Filming, videotaping, and photographing the interior of the Courthouse, including the courtrooms, through windows or the glass portions of the courtroom doors is prohibited.

No microphones, cameras or recording devices shall be permitted in any courtroom, unless the judge hearing the matter within the courtroom has expressly authorized the same in a written order, pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 1.150. This rule does not prevent anyone from possessing a cell phone or other mobile device while in the courtroom, but it does prohibit the activation of any microphone and/or camera contained in the device unless it has been approved by a Judge of Superior Court in a written order.

A copy of the order approving media coverage must be presented to the Bailiff, stationed at the entrance of the courthouse, prior to any coverage commencing. If such an order is not presented, media coverage may be prohibited.

Violations of this standing order may be enforced by the sheriff's office (see, e.g., Code Civ. Proc., § 1209(a)5) and Pen. Code, §§ 166(a)(4) and 602.1).

This standing order shall expire on December 31, 2026.
