Pursuant to California Rules of Court, rule 1.150(a), the Court authorizes on duty law enforcement officers employed by the Tehama County Sheriff's Department assigned to court security to activate a body worn camera, or any appliance fitted with a recording device, to record contact with an individual(s) only when that individual(s) is not complying with a command from an on duty Tehama County Sheriff's Department law enforcement officer assigned to court security and a use of force appears reasonably imminent inside the Tehama County Superior Court courthouse, courtrooms, detention areas, or courthouse entrances and exits.	
Except as provided above, activation of body-worn cameras by any law enforcement officers working or conducting business in the court is prohibited inside the courthouse, courtrooms, detention areas, and courthouse entrances and exits.	
This standing order shall expire on December 31, 2021.
